Activities

Design a sandwich

Set up a sandwich bar for a classroom or library tasting. Have a bread section, a filling section, and a sampling section. Provide gluten-free "breads" and fillings that can please a variety of palates. After the sandwiches are prepared, share the favorites that made the top ten list.

Sketch a map

Supplies needed: pieces of brown paper, marking pens, pencils, glue, and stickers. Wad up a piece of brown paper. Smooth it flat. Create a map of bear's journey from the forest to the city and his return. Draw a symbol to represent each stop. Design a map key for each of the symbols. Devise a measuring system to figure out how far the bear trudged. Add supplement symbols and items to make the journey more interesting for bear. Share your results with a partner.

Compare and contrast

Create a spreadsheet for each point of interest for bear's journey. Assign a point system for each item. One column will rate the items from bear's perspective. Columns two and three will feature the narrator and the owner of the sandwich. Which items rate higher for each character?

Synopsis

A group of frog friends are happy living in their peaceful pond. One day a visitor arrives who is not a frog, but a little pink pig. Little pink pig sits contently in the middle of their pond. When he opens his mouth, "RIBBIT!" comes out. The frogs are confused and annoyed with the thought that the pig thinks he is a frog or they wonder if pig is making fun of them.

"What did that little pig just say?" "Does he think he's a frog?" "Is he making fun of us?"

Soon, all of the animals are curious to know what is going on with the pig. After much guessing and arguing and a visit to the wise old beetle, the animals come to the realization that maybe the pig just wanted to make new friends. But is it too late?

- How do you feel when you try to make a new friend, but they do not want to be your friend?
- How are you and your friends different? How are you the same?
- Name three things that you like about your friends.
- What do you think that the frogs could have learned from the pig if they were willing to be his friend?
- Why do you think the pig said "RIBBIT!"? How do you think the pig would have responded if the frogs said "OINK!"?

Activities(Candlewick Press)

Sam and Dave Dig a Maze

Sam and Dave set out on an adventure to dig for something spectacular. Children will have a similar experience with this activity. Play a game with the group by having the children seek out an object. Select one student to blindfold. Then place the object somewhere in the room. The remaining children may take turns directing the blindfolded child to the location of the object. For example, "take two steps left," "walk forward", "stop", and so on. This activity will get the children moving and enforce the concept of left versus right and listening skills. As a follow up activity, distribute some paper mazes for the children to try.

Something Spectacular

Although Sam and Dave do not find the hidden jewels, they still find something spectacular at the end of the story.

Ask the children what made their adventure spectacular. Ask: What types of activities do you find exciting? If you were to dig to find something spectacular, what would you hope to find? In their notebooks or on paper, have the children describe and illustrate their own search for something spectacular.
